
4th Sunday of Lent (A)

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 23. R. v. 1

- The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing <u>I</u> shall want; fresh and green are the pastures where he gives <u>me</u> repose. Near restful wa<u>ters</u> he leads me; he re<u>vives</u> my soul. *R*
- 2. He guides me along the right path, for the sake <u>of</u> his name. Though I should walk in the valley of the sha<u>dow</u> of death, no evil would I fear, for <u>you</u> are with me. Your crook and your staff will <u>give</u> me comfort. *R*
- You have prepared a ta<u>ble</u> for me in the sight <u>of</u> my foes.
 My head you have anoint<u>ed</u> with oil; my cup is <u>ov</u>erflowing. *R*
- Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life.
 In the Lord's own house shall I dwell for length of days unending. *R*

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor and repeated by all; it is then repeated after each verse.
