

- 1. Bless the <u>Lord</u>, my soul! Lord God, how <u>great</u> you are. How many are your <u>works</u>, O Lord! The earth is <u>full</u> of your riches. *R*
- 2. May the glory of the Lord <u>last</u> for ever! May the Lord rejoice <u>in</u> his works! May my thoughts be pleasing to him. I find my joy in the Lord. *R*
- 3. You take back your spi<u>rit</u>, they die, returning to the dust from <u>which</u> they came. You send forth your spirit, they <u>are</u> created; and you renew the <u>face</u> of the earth. *R*

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor, and then sung by all; it is then repeated by all after each verse.
