


- You, O Lord, <u>are</u> my portion;
 I have promised to o<u>bey</u> your words.
 The law from your mouth means <u>more</u> to me than large quantities of sil<u>ver</u> and gold. *R*
- Let your merciful <u>love</u> console me by your promise <u>to</u> your servant.
 Show me compassion, that <u>I</u> may live, for your law is <u>my</u> delight. *R*
- 3. That is why I love <u>your</u> commands more than <u>finest</u> gold, why I rule my life <u>by</u> your precepts: and <u>hate</u> false ways. *R*
- 4. Your decrees are wonder<u>ful</u> indeed; therefore my <u>soul</u> obeys them.
 The unfolding of your <u>word</u> gives light, and understanding <u>to</u> the simple. *R*

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor and repeated by all; it is then repeated after each verse.
