
## 28th Sunday of Ordinary Time (A)

  In the Lord's house <u>shall</u> I dwell for length of <u>days</u> unending. *R*

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor and repeated by all; it is then repeated after each verse.
