**R** The wa-ters of a ri-ver give joy to God's ci-ty, the ho-ly place where the most high dwells.



- 1. God is for us a re<u>fuge</u> and strength, a helper close at hand, in time <u>of</u> distress: so we shall not fear, though the <u>earth</u> should rock, though the mountains fall into the depths <u>of</u> the sea. *R*
- 2. The waters of a river give joy to God's city, the holy place where the Most High dwells. God is within, it cannot be shaken; God will help it at the dawning of the day. *R*
- 3. The Lord of <u>hosts</u> is with us: the God of Jacob <u>is</u> our stronghold.

  Come, consider the works <u>of</u> the Lord, the redoubtable deeds he has done <u>on</u> the earth. *R*

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor, and then sung by all; it is then repeated by all after each verse.
