
## 32nd Sunday of Ordinary Time (A)

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 63:2-8. R. v 2

- O God, you are my God; at <u>dawn</u> I seek you; for you my <u>soul</u> is thirsting.
  For you my <u>flesh</u> is pining, like a dry, dreary land <u>with</u>out water. *R*
- I have come before you <u>in</u> the sanctuary, to behold your strength <u>and</u> your glory. Your loving mercy is bet<u>ter</u> than life, my lips will <u>speak</u> your praise. *R*
- I will bless you <u>all</u> my life; in your name I will lift <u>up</u> my hands.
   My soul shall be filled as <u>with</u> a banquet; with joyful lips, my <u>mouth</u> shall praise you. *R*
- For you have <u>been</u> my strength; in the shadow of your wings <u>I</u> rejoice. My soul clings <u>fast</u> to you; your right <u>hand</u> upholds me. *R*

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor and repeated by all; it is then repeated after each verse.
