


- In you, O Lord, <u>I</u> take refuge;
 let me never be <u>put</u> to shame.
 In your uprightness, res<u>cue</u> me, free me;
 incline your ear to me and save me. *R*
- 2. Be my rock, my <u>con</u>stant refuge, a mighty stronghold to save me, for you are my <u>rock</u>, my stronghold. Free me from the hand <u>of</u> the wicked. **R**
- 3. It is you, O Lord, who are my hope, my trust, O Lord, from my youth.
 On you I have leaned from my birth; from my mother's womb, you have drawn me forth. R
- 4. My mouth will tell of your justice and all the day long of your salvation.
 O God, you have taught me from my youth and I proclaim your wonders still. *R*

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor and repeated by all; it is then repeated after each verse.
