
5th Sunday of Lent (C)

- When the Lord brought back the exiles of Zion, we thought we were dreaming.
 Then was our mouth <u>filled</u> with laughter; on our tongues, <u>songs</u> of joy. *R*
- 2. Then they said a<u>mong</u> the nations,
 "What great deeds the Lord <u>worked</u> for them!"
 What great deeds the Lord <u>worked</u> for us!
 Indeed, <u>we</u> were glad. *R*
- 3. Bring back our exiles, O Lord, as streams in the Negeb.

 Those who are sowing in tears will sing when they reap. *R*
- 4. They go out, they go out, <u>full</u> of tears, carrying seed <u>for</u> the sowing; they come back, they come back <u>with</u> a song, bear<u>ing</u> their sheaves. *R*

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor and repeated by all; it is then repeated after each verse.
