
18th Sunday of Ordinary Time (C)

R O Lord, you have been our re-fuge, from ge - ne-ra-tion to ge - ne - ra-tion.





- You turn man <u>back</u> to dust and say: 'Return, O child<u>ren</u> of Adam.'
 To your eyes a thousand years are like yesterday, <u>come</u> and gone, or like a watch <u>in</u> the night. *R*
- 2. You sweep them away <u>like</u> a dream, like grass which is fresh <u>in</u> the morning. In the morning it sprouts <u>and</u> is fresh: by evening it withers and fades. *R*
- 3. Then teach us to number our days, that we may gain wisdom of heart. Turn back, O Lord! How long? Show pity to your servants. *R*
- 4. At dawn, fill us with your mer<u>ci</u>ful love; we shall exult and rejoice <u>all</u> our days.
 Let the favour of the Lord our God <u>be</u> upon us; give success to the work <u>of</u> our hands. *R*

The refrain is heard three times at the start: first played on the organ, then sung by the cantor and repeated by all; it is then repeated after each verse.
